After all, it is part of our Torah faith to hope and wait for Mashiah daily.

OK, with this being said, let me address now a serious concern I have. With regards to the coming of Mashiah, rest assured he will come, this year, next year or in a hundred years, in one way or another, when the time is right, Mashiah will come and as the prophet says, Mashiah and his army of angels will set the world straight once and for all. Yet, like I said, while we wait and hope for this daily, it still may not happen for a long time to come. Therefore, we must understand this, take it into account and live our lives accordingly.

Granted, the End of Days may be upon us; apocalypse may very well just be around the corner; gloom and doom may be awaiting us all at any moment; but then again, maybe not!

LIFE IS MEANT TO BE LIVED BY THE LIVING, NOT BY THE WALKING DEAD! WE CANNOT GO ON THROUGH LIFE JUST WAITING FOR EVERYTHING TO MIRACULOUSLY CHANGE.

We cannot expect a magical Mashiah to suddenly appear out of nowhere and wave his magic wand making all the world's problems disappear. This is not the hope and faith sincere Torah-believing Jews have in the coming of Mashiah. Anyone who embraces such infantile and immature beliefs about magical redemptions certainly demonstrates a lack of Torah knowledge about the coming of Mashiah and worse it expresses symptoms of delusional thinking.

THERE IS NO MAGIC WAND TO WAVE; THERE IS NO MAGIC PILL TO TAKE; THERE IS NO MAGIC AND THERE WILL BE NO MAGIC. MAGIC AND TORAH DO NOT JIVE WITH ONE ANOTHER.

Every individual must choose between the fantasy of magic and the reality of Torah. As for me, I chose Torah. And I feel that I must elaborate on exactly what this means because the definition of living a Torah life today has become so twisted and perverted that its true meaning is becoming lost in an avalanche of imposter life styles.

Living a Torah life means just that, living by Torah, and not by one's personal interpretation of what it means to be religious. The Torah Way includes numerous paths and these include many different walks of life, culture and ethnicity. Any path along the Torah Way is kosher (legitimate), regardless of how different it may be from another path. Look around! This same ugly face has risen again and it is threatening to destroy our communities and to again make Jews and Judaism a pariah in the eyes of the world. We have enough enemies in this world who hate us and want to kill us for no cause; we do not need to make matters worse and give our enemies good reasons to hate us!

The nation of Israel today seethes with such extreme religious radicalization. Hatred abounds towards other religious individuals, Sages and even entire communities. How on earth does one expect a magical Mashiah to come and magically make all the hate go away?
